Independent Examiner's Report

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Oakworth PCC

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2020, which are set out on pages 2 to 8.

Respective responsibilities of the examiner

The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed

It is my responsibility to:

Basis of independent examiner's report

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis.

Funds

Unrestricted funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and available for application in the general purposes of the PCC. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the PCC are also unrestricted in that the PCC is free to redesignate them.

Restricted funds may only be expended on the specific object for which they were given. Any balance remaining unspent at the end of the year must be carried forward as a balance on that fund.

The accounts include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Fixed assets

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the statement of assets and liabilities in accordance with section 10 (2)(a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

Movable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a facility for disposal, are accounted as inalienable property unless consecrated. They are listed in the church's inventory which can be inspected at any reasonable time. For inalienable property acquired prior to 2000, there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the accounts. Items acquired since 1 January 2000 have been capitalised and depreciated over their currently anticipated useful economic life on a straight line basis.

All expenditure incurred in the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings, individual items under £1,000, or on the repair of movable church furnishings acquired before 1 January 2001 is written off.

Furniture and equipment used within the church premises is depreciated in the statement of assets and liabilities on a straight line basis over 10 years.

Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £100 or less are not included in the statement of assets and liabilities.

Current Assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December are shown as debtors in the statement of assets and liabilities.

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the CBF Church Of England funds or at the bank.

1 Accounting Policies (Continued)

Fund Details

Endowment funds

In 2009 a generous bequest of £10,000 was received from the estate of Michael Wright, a member of Cross Roads but a long time friend of Christ Church. The bequest is restricted in that only the interest can be used to support the maintenance of the churchyard, where his ashes are now interred in the family grave.

Restricted funds

In March 2017 a donation of £10,000 was received from a donor wishing to remain anonymous, gift aid of £2,500 was claimed giving a gross donation of £12,500. The donation was restricted in that it can only be used to fund the current phase of the Development Plan (lighting, heating repair, flooring and decoration) As at 1 January 2019 the donation had been partially spent with £5,582 remaining, it has now been fully spent.

In March 2018 a donation of £10,000 was received from a donor wishing to remain anonymous, gift aid of £2,500 was claimed giving a gross donation of £12,500. The donation was restricted in that it can only be used to fund the current phase of the Development Plan (lighting, heating repair, flooring and decoration). The donation has been fully spent in the year.

Various Talents donations totalling £12,248 were received in 2018, gift aid of £1,975 was claimed giving gross donations of £14,223. The donations were restricted in that they can only be used to fund the new Church Development Plan. As at 1 January 2019 the donations had been partially spent with £8,834 remaining, they have now been fully spent.

Various donations totalling £12,735 were received in 2019, gift aid of £1,895 was claimed giving gross donations of £14,630. The donations were restricted in that they can only be used to fund the new Church chairs. The donations have been partially spent with £3,176 remaining.

In January 2019 a donation of £25,000 was received from a donor wishing to remain anonymous, gift aid of £5,669 was claimed. The donation was restricted in that it can only be used to fund the Church Development Plan. The donation has been partially spent with £6,568 remaining.

In March 2019 a donation of £8,000 was received from a donor wishing to remain anonymous, gift aid of £2,000 was claimed giving a gross donation of £10,000. The donation was restricted in that it can only be used to fund the Church Development Plan. The donation has been fully spent in the year.
