Brief History of our Grade II listed building

1846

The church was built for the people of Oakworth with the help of generous local benefactors contributing to the original cost. The original church had no pews!

1865 The clock was added and a cast iron bell hung in the tower. The first set of pews were installed.

1875 The East Window was installed.

1885 The pews were replaced.

1886 A small choir vestry extension was added to the base of the tower, which is now a kitchen.

1889 The chancel arch was widened and remodelled.

1925 The beautiful oak carved Reredos featuring the 'Northern Saints' was installed and was the work of renowned local artist and craftsman Alex Smith.

1987 The church was modernised with the formation of the current meeting room, toilets and kitchen.

Whilst the exterior of the building has seen little change the interior of the Church has undergone a steady evolution from the very beginning. All of this history is very important to the heritage of Oakworth Village, although it is very costly for us to maintain.

What about now?

These are challenging times for Churches, communities and local services, but we believe the future is bright.

We have established strong links with our community, schools and local families by holding regular events such as Friday Film Night, Children's Holiday Clubs, Easter and Christmas Crafts, Art Exhibitions, Food Festivals and Wine and Beer Tasting Evenings.

The church is a large building which could be used by the whole village, but we need to make it more accessible and suitable for multi-use.

The building at present has its difficulties including access, inflexible interior space, inadequate toilet facilities and lack of car parking.

The Parochial Church Council in consultation with the congregation, specialist architects and diocesan experts, have a vision and plan to make the Church building a more usable, accessible and efficient space. This will provide essential community space, improve our worship experience and develop the building to support growth in the years to come.



What are we going to do? Phase 1 breakdown:

- Improve the lighting already completed!
- Remove the pews and replace with chairs to create an adaptable space suitable for a wide range of activities and styles of worship.
- Repair the heating, making it more efficient.
- Install new flooring.
- Decorate the interior.

Phase 2 will develop:

• Car parking and a new Church entrance.

Phase 3 will:

- Develop the upstairs rooms.
- Provide new kitchen and toilet facilities.
- Expand meeting and worship spaces.

Raising Funds
